NEED FOR NURSING ASSISTANTS

Health care is a leading business in Nashville and Davidson County with more than 29 hospitals, medical centers, clinics, and specialty centers throughout the region. The county also has 30 licensed nursing homes, 13 homes for the aged, and 10 hospice organizations.

The latest Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Tennessee Health Workforce Profile persons employed in the Tennessee health sector. By 2020, the population in Tennessee is expected to grow 15% with the population over the age of 65 to grow 65%.

- Tennessee ranked 28th among the states in the number of nurse aides, orderlies, and attendants (25,230) employed in the health professions field (or 464 per 100,000 population projected national growth rate of 22.3%.
- Tennessee ranked 40th in the nation with 5,130 home health aides (or 94 per 100,000 population) employed in the health professions field. Home health aide employment in Tennessee is expected to increase by 75.7% .

Classes taught by highly experienced and licensed registered nurses;

Training prepares students to take The Nurses Assistant Certification Examination.

Students received a CPR Certification in Basic Life Support (BLS).

Teaching strategies include: lecture, audio-visuals, video presentations, hand-outs on particular topics, nurses aide booklet, independent study, demonstration, return demonstration and practice, case presentations, quizzes, clinical evaluation, and guest or other professional lecturers.

The clinical facilities are nursing homes throughout the Davidson County.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this program, applicants must: Have a high school diploma or a GED.

Be able to meet the physical demands of working continuously for 8 to 12 hours.

Be able to emotionally work in fast and sometimes demanding environment and situations.

Have the ability to make meaningful observations and write brief and accurate reports.

Have the ability to recognize the needs of people and maintain good relationships in dealing with them.

Be willing to work and follow the directions of health disciplines and professionals as deemed appropriate.

Make a personal commitment to finish the training in the required time period.
